To the Lil'wat Community

As you all know – we have been trying to work on some Dog Solutions – we will be proceeding with a game plan.

Attached is information for you and also a bit about our action plans in moving forward:

1. **Owner Release Agreement** – if you are interested in just giving up your dog voluntarily please fill out this form and call Lands office and we can pick it up. (604-894-2333)
2. **Lil'wat's Safety By-Law** – for your FYI
3. **Information Reading on types of diseases on Dogs within our community:**
 - a) Campylobacter
 - b) Giardia
 - c) Tapeworms
 - d) Fleas
 - e) Rabies
 - f) Scabies

In working with WAG – most of the dogs that have been brought to WAG from Lil'wat had disease (a – Campy), which is through dog poop and can be transferred easily to our children through schools, daycares, shoes, homes. Dog Poop (feces) should always be picked up in order to prevent this from happening.

So first and foremost – if you want your dog picked up please fill out the form; if you need assistance please ask. (we can get this done sooner than July 29th & 30th)

Secondly – we will still be collecting and taking stray dogs come July 29th & 30th (tag or no tag)

Thirdly – we are also working with WAG – we will be having another spayed/neuter program for the month of August, details to be confirmed but if you are interested in this please contact Lands office (604-894-2333)

Also – this project will not be a one-time initiative, we will be continuing to offer the services over the next 6-months in regards to people wanting to give up Dogs – we are finalizing a location as to where we can house dogs and people can drop off. (details will be coming forward)

Lastly – I really need the “Community’s support in this initiative”, I need the community to assist in volunteering to give up their dogs prior to me just taking them – as you all know this is a serious concern from a lot of community members.

Most of us Lil’wats don’t take care of the dogs and treat them as one of our family members and that is what the dogs require – so we need to think twice prior to owning a dog. A lot of TLC should be going into owning a dog.
